As I embark on a new beginning, I want to thank you all for the support and opportunities you gave me over the last several years. While Oklee is a fairly remote isolated place, it is also a great place away from the chaos of the larger areas. I am not looking forward to having to deal with a lot of traffic again. It was so nice having 6 miles, actually means 6 minutes. There definitely are advantages to a slower pace. There is so much richness in rural living and the heritage of having interconnected family trees.

You have also been very open to me trying new things like different music, incorporating technology, more combined and outdoor services. We've added a mid-summer block party and Thanksgiving Day dinner for the community in partnership with the local Catholic church. Not everything went over well. This year I experimented with a Wednesday Night monthly more relaxed worship. Many churches are having success with doing more on Wednesday nights. Yet it seems that doesn't fit here at this time.

As you move forward, you will have the opportunity now to find what fits you best as faith communities. People pulling together to work out logistics and negotiating what to keep and what to let go of is a really good time to shape the church in what way that best serves you and the community. Please be supportive of your leadership during this time. Also consider stepping forward to volunteer more, give compliments and positive suggestions.

Some of you may be struggling with the loss of the better old days. That's natural. The reality is that the world and culture shifts with the passing of generations. Some of these shifts will be better while others might not. One struggle with the shifting culture is that people are getting more and more separated by different political parties and other major cultural shifts. I want to remind you that the church at large has survived 2,000 years of major shifts. God doesn't change and Jesus never abandons us. Your faith can be a solid foundation in the midst of the chaos you may sense in your life.

Faith practices can change but the good news of our savior doesn't. You are brothers and sisters in Christ. Like any family, it will be important for you to gather together. It will be important for you to gather for communion and the sharing of other food. It will be important for you to pray and lift each other up in prayer. I also suggest if you don't already, start a devotion practice of reading you bible regularly or using a devotional. Your parish does provide one, or you can look for something that fits you better. The point is to stay focused and grounded in Christ.

Remember Jesus slept in a boat while a storm raged around him. Once the disciples cried out to him in their fear, he calmed the storm outside and inside them. Don't hesitate to cry out to Jesus when you are afraid, frustrated or confused. He does calm the storms we are going through. I know you are in the best hands possible moving forward, Christs.

Once again, I want to thank you for the blessing of our time together these last several years. Go in peace and serve the Lord. Thanks be to God.

The 2024 March Campaign ran from February 26th – April 6th. We kept track of how many pounds of food was donated and also the cash donations that came in. It all gets reported back to the FoodShare program.

This year during that timeframe we collected \$2,290.78 for our food shelf and 53 pounds of food! We haven't received our matching funds yet but look forward to adding that to our program when it comes. I just want to thank you for your donations, our church communities are so generous to our food shelf and we are very grateful for your support.

This last month we also had a neat addition to our food shelf. The North Country Food Bank had an excess of dog food and cat food. We were able to receive a pallet of each at no cost to us. This has been requested and has flown out the door! So many of our families have animals and the price of food for them continues to rise. I'm hoping that there are many happy dogs and cats out there with this new addition. We will be on the look out if it becomes available again to try to get some more for our furry residents.

If you know of someone who could use some food or if you would like to pick up a food box to bring out to them please feel free to contact me directly, I'd be happy to explain the process and help arrange it.

Pastors Report: Lent services went well. Looking towards confirmation on Sunday May 5th. Confirmands are at Zion, no confirmation kids from Salem; kids are working on final statements and will be decorating stoles. April 21st is the blessing of quilts.

Old Business: Chair lift is being used, positive comments from congregations that it is available. Quarter round for the flooring is still needed. Lisa will reach out to Leif to find out if that was ordered.

Headstones are still in need of repair; Kyle will call Valley cemetery maintenance to get an estimate.

Discussion around posting an ad in the newspaper for cemetery maintenance donations. If you are not a member you need to buy a cemetery lot. Current cost of cemetery lot was discussed, no changes will be made at this time. Bathrooms still need to be remodeled; Lisa will revisit the previous list of items needed for cost.

New Business: Church Insurance Policy increased in cost this year. Wyatt and Lisa received quotes for a new policy that is closer to our budget. Motion to change insurance agencies, motion carried: 1st Ginny, and 2nd Kyle. Wyatt will complete the paperwork for the new policy.


