There's Bad News...And Good News

Last month, I wrote about current predictions of drastic declines in membership for all mainline churches, including the ELCA. That's bad news.

But there is good news...if we only know what to do with it.

Another current study shows surprising statistics that give new hope to those same churches. The past showed Elders (born before 1946) and Boomers (born between 1946 and 1964) as more committed Christians than younger generations.

However, since 2021, there has been a groundswell in people declaring a "personal commitment to Jesus", especially those in the groups known as Millennials (born between 1984 and 1998, ages 41 through 27) and Gen Z (born between 1999 and 2015, ages 26 through 10).

According to the latest data, 66 percent of all U.S. adults say they have made a personal commitment to Jesus that is still important in their life today. That marks a 12-percentage-point increase since 2021, when commitment levels reached their lowest point of 54 percent, in over 30 years of tracking.

This shift is not only statistically significant—it may be the clearest indication of meaningful spiritual renewal in the United States. Since then, the research shows a steady, year-over-year increase in the key indicator. This multi-year climb in public sentiment toward Jesus equates to nearly 30 million more U.S. adults who claim to be following Jesus today than in 2021

David Kinnaman, CEO of Barna Group says, "Many people have predicted the growing irrelevance of Christianity; however, this data shows that spiritual trends have a dynamism and can, indeed, change. This is the clearest trend we've seen in more than a decade, pointing to spiritual renewal—and it's the first time Barna has recorded such spiritual interest being led by younger generations."

Another counterintuitive trend: men—especially younger men—are more likely to be Jesus followers than are younger women.

Many people are now open to spirituality and Jesus, but are **hesitant to embrace organized religion** or identify as Christian...they want to be affiliated with Jesus, but not with the Church or with Christianity as a religious identity—at least not yet.

This is a moment both to celebrate and to steward. People are open—perhaps as much as any time in recent memory—to Jesus. Kinnaman says, "Christians should be encouraged to hold greater confidence in the gospel and to meet this significant opportunity by cultivating deep-rooted discipleship."

As Christian leaders navigate this changing landscape, one thing is clear: Jesus is still attracting people—even those who have left the pews or never sat in them. The opportunity is not just to count commitments and membership, but to help shape people into strong, lifelong disciples who share Christ with others.

If churches can meet people with openness, authenticity, humility, and a focus on discipleship, they may find fresh opportunities to minister and help all people, including Millennials and Gen Z, grow in faith.



Dates for July would be July 13 and July 27.



June 10, 2025

Meeting was called to order by President David Hofstad. SAM Marijo Vik lead the group in prayer.

Secretary's Report was read by Alice Hofstad. Alice had a correction to the Secretary's Report. The motion was to not go forward with the updated Church Directory instead of the motion being made to approve pictures in the history book. Motion to accept Secretary's Report - 1st by Leif Kolstoe; 2nd by Ron Hegge

Pastor's/SAM Report: Marijo resumed services on April 1, 2025. She has had the funeral for Morris Hendrickson, met with Confirmation Students and participated in the making of the stoles with both churches. She attended both confirmation banquets. She officiated the Bennet Larson funeral and the Leona Christianson funeral is this weekend at Zion. She has visited Don and Alma Stenberg and Brian Peterson. She has been asked to be part of a Multipoint Affinity Group. She will be attending a Synod conference meeting in Plummer. She was contacted by Our Savior's Lutheran Church in McIntosh to see if she would be available to help as their Parish has broken up. She offered to do Wednesday evening services with their church for the time being.

Old Business: Lisa is going to contact Bonny to get a membership list to update a member directory. The picnic went well. There was a suggestion to not serve brats in the future and do just hamburgers and hotdogs instead. The first bathroom is in the process of being remodeled. The Board of Education cleaned the storage areas in the basement. A picture that is in memory of Otto Kvasager needs to be reframed or stored.
